Dear Student:

By filling in these forms you are embarking on the very first step of quite a long process of becoming an exchange student with YFU South Africa!

Please take careful note of the following comments:

1. After filling in Forms A1, A2, C1 and C2 and obtaining the confidential school evaluation (Form B) you should contact your YFU representative immediately, so he/she can explain to you what to do next.
2. Once these forms have been handed back to your YFU representative together with your latest two school reports, a selection interview will follow, and if you are accepted, the roller-coaster ride of getting the paperwork done will begin.
3. You will then receive some more forms to fill in or have filled in and signed by your parents / legal guardians as well as forms that need to be filled in and signed by your doctor and dentist.
4. You will need to apply for a passport immediately.
5. You will have to get some passport sized photos taken of yourself.
- 6. Please note that you need to apply as early as possible for your visa. The visa application is your responsibility, but YFU will give the necessary back-up support where and when necessary.**
7. Once ALL the paperwork has been done, you need to have it collected by your YFU representative, who will forward it to the YFU office for further administration and processing.
8. If everything is in order, your file and information will be sent to your host country YFU organization, who will then start looking for a hostfamily and school for you.
